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

disinfectants. Cleaning will remove dirt and some germs but not kill viruses.

Disinfecting aims to kill most germs and viruses, depending on the type of chemical use

-Touch Areas Cleaning ² Twice Daily

In addition to routine cleaning, custodial staff will clean high touch surfaces twice per day that have frequent contact with hands and when visibly dirty.
