Dear Superior-Greenstone DSB Families,

On the eve of the March Break, we are reaching out to you to provide you with an overview of the new requirements that were communicated to school boards across Ontario on March 9, by the Ministry of Education and the Chief Medical Officer of Health. These requirements include the lifting of most of the health and safety measures that have been in place in schools for the past two years. At this time, note the following changes:

This is a simple safety measure that provides additional protection to everyone, which will reduce the spread of the virus, and assist in keeping our schools open.

- 3. will continue to be provided to all students and staff.

 - students must continue to screen daily before coming to work. The screening tool has once again been updated and can be found at https://covid-19.ontario.ca/school-screening/. All school visitors, including parent/caregivers, are strongly encouraged to screen prior to entering the building, and to stay home if you have symptoms.

While SGDSB is required to adhere to these changes, we are committed to a careful and cautious approach to the lifting of COVID-19 restrictions. We are aware of the number of positive COVID-19 cases in our communities, the lower vaccination rates in the district, and the impact that staff shortages is having on the school's ability to function. We will continue to make masks available to students and staff upon request and will reinforce hand washing/use of hand sanitizers, respiratory etiquette (e.g. disposal of used tissues). The enhanced cleaning measures will remain in place, as will the focus on effective ventilation in all learning spaces. Student and staff attendance is important, and school we

principals will be engaging in a staged approach to reintro
