H. Wilson-Boast reported that the Board Strategic Direction Plan, set to commence under the direction of Scott Ferguson of Progress Consulting would assist in prioritizing the Boards' goals for school improvement, student success and effective use of board resources in education delivery. A meeting to train five facilitators to convene community and regional consultations will take place shortly. Local community consultations constitute Phase I of the project in early to mid-October. Phase II Regional Consultations are proposed for the late October in the communities of Geraldton, Marathon, Terrace Bay and Red Rock. Board staffs, parents, students and community members are being encouraged to attend the forums. In November, Senior Administration, the Board and representatives from Phase I and II will convene to review the input gathered and develop an implementation plan for Board approval in January 2005.
